Uniform Policy

Rationale:

At Fish Creek & District Primary School we believe that:

- Uniform promotes collective pride in the school, enhancing school identity, tone, morale and general appearance.
- Appropriate clothing reduces risk of injury and promotes security.
- Uniform reduces potential peer pressure to wear fashion items.

1. AIMS

- To create a positive image for the child and the school
- To ensure students are dressed to reduce risk to themselves and others
- To develop a sense of unity and school pride and reduce fashion peer pressure
- To ensure all students have access to second hand uniform

2. IMPLEMENTATION

- The uniform colours are gold and navy
- The logo will be our school's '*FISH*'
- The words Fish Creek & District Primary will be printed on garments that can be printed on in a cost effective manner.
- Wearing of the school colours is compulsory
- A pre-condition of excursions is uniform
- Camps and Special days may be uniform-free
- Grade 6 students may wear a special 'Final Year' polo and jumper
- A written parent request will be required for special exemptions to be granted by the principal
- School hats must be worn during terms 1 and 4
- Shoes must have closed toes and be safe
- Jewellery – watches and studs/sleepers only
- Make-up – not allowed

Where a student is out of uniform without explanation the school will issue a "School Uniform Notice" to parents

Standard Uniform

Polo Shirt	- Navy/Gold polo shirt (purchased from school)
Tops	- Half-zip fleecy or track-suit top (purchased from school)
Pants/shorts	- Navy
Dress	- Navy and white check
Hat	- Navy (purchased from school)
Skirt/skorts	- Navy

3. EVALUATION

- The effectiveness of the Uniform policy will be evaluated yearly by the staff
- A periodic major review, examining latest educational trends, will be carried in consultation with students, staff and parents utilising outside experts.
